



## Raising Cane's Project description N. Arlington Heights Road & E. Palatine Road

Raising Cane's is a quick serve restaurant that was founded in 1996 in Baton Rouge, LA by its founder, Todd Graves. The restaurant has ONE LOVE, which is chicken, as evident by the minimal menu that includes: chicken fingers, fries, cole slaw and Texas toast. The food is always cooked to order to ensure the best quality and flavor possible.

Raising Cane's is not a chain restaurant, but is part of the community, starting with the name of the city being part of the painted mural on the side of the building. The restaurant not only employs people from the area, but gives back to the community in several ways. By promoting education, feeding the hungry, pet welfare, local community involvement and more.

The building itself promotes visual esthetics with the variations not only in the architecture, but the building materials themselves. The use of a brick wainscot with EIFS above is accented by the use of full brick facades and limestone (hydraulic limestone) at the main entrances and drive thru areas to provide a seamless look to the 'towers'. All of this with the variations in the heights of the building, along with the ample landscaping around the building provides an esthetically pleasing structure that accents the development unlike the fast food 'box style of many businesses. Though there are no 'green' features to the landscaping, Raising Cane's designs with native plants to ensure they are best suited for the local climate and conditions.

The structure is approximately 3,800 square feet, including a masonry corral at the rear of the building for operations. The roof line around the exterior varies from the main façade at 16'-7", to the towers for the entrances and drive thru pick-up at 19'-10", the lower drive thru tower at 17'-3" and finally the ONE (for the one love) at the main entrance topping out at 23'-4".

Raising Cane's will have approximately 55 employees at this location, with an average of 8 employees per shift. The restaurant will be open Sun - Thu: 10:00am - 12:00am; Fri - Sat: 10:00am - 2:00am. The drive Thru will have the hours of operation.

The project is being submitted to the Planning Commission for review 4/12/19 with a tentative date of a Plan Commission Meeting of 7/10/19. The building plans will be submitted for permitting after Planning and Design Commission approval with a construction start date of mid-October. The project will have a 175 day construction schedule with an anticipated opening date of 3/20/2020.
