Dear VAH Plan Commission,

I received a Notice of Public Hearing for the Southpoint Out-lot, property 711-715, that will take place this week on Wednesday, January 12th.

My name is Lindsey Frank and I live on Palatine Rd. and N. Pinetree Dr. and have been a resident for almost nine years with my husband, Royce Frank. I was hoping to attend this hearing, but may not be able to due to a meeting I have prior that may run late. However, I wanted to submit a write-in with a public concern for consideration (as there was not a contact listed for the Village for write-ins, and I hope this message is received).

Although the hearing is asking specifically about an amendment to the parking island Municipal Code, I have a different concern that I would like to be considered. I have concerns about the change in the amount of traffic to this location that can have a negative impact on the traffic flow, specifically with the "passthrough" intersection at N. Eastwood and Palatine Road. There are a large number of accidents at this "passthrough" intersection and I worry with the new restaurant (especially as a drive-through) would increase the number of accidents, especially with increasing the number of families and children passengers who are not familiar with the area and how to drive on Palatine Road--which is a skill of itself because it is not like other roads in our area.

I would like to request that there be an analysis of the accidents to this location's passthrough intersection at Eastwood and that a consideration of redirecting traffic flow from that driveway entrance/exit from the shopping center to reduce the number of drivers who go straight to the passthrough, which essentially are a total of 6.5 lanes of traffic. Purpose: To protect the customers, families, children, surrounding neighbors, and our community from harm due to accidents.

Example considerations:

- Place a sign at the passthrough stating "do not enter" facing the shopping center driveway
- Place a sign at the shopping center driveway that says "right turn only"
- Close the passthrough
- Add a light
- Etc.

The number of injuries and frequency of accidents at this passthrough intersection is already alarming, the amount of "close calls" of vehicles getting T-boned and ending up on home properties are alarming.
